



Trump's Gettysburg Address

Back in October, Donald Trump gave his own Gettysburg Address. He stated what he would do in his first 100 days, in the event that he became President. His plan had three main themes: Cleaning up Washington, Protecting American Workers and Restoring Rule of Law.

Trump called it a “contract between him and the American Voter.” Here are the measures he said, back then, about what he would do on Day One:

Clean up the Corruption and Special Interest Collusion in Washington, DC



- ① Impose term limits
- ② Hiring freeze on all federal employees
- ③ For every new federal regulation, two existing regulations must be eliminated
- ④ 5 year-ban on becoming lobbyists
- ⑤ Lifetime ban on lobbying on behalf of a foreign government
- ⑥ Complete ban on foreign lobbyists raising money for American elections

7 Actions to Protect American workers



- ① Renegotiate NAFTA
- ② Withdraw from the Trans-Pacific Partnership
- ③ Label China a currency manipulator
- ④ Identify all foreign trading abuses; end those abuses immediately
- ⑤ Lift the restrictions on job-producing American energy reserves
- ⑥ Allow vital energy infrastructure projects
- ⑦ Cancel billions in payments to U.N. climate change programs

5 Actions to Restore Security and the Constitutional Rule of Law



- ① Cancel every unconstitutional executive action, memorandum and order issued by President Obama
- ② Select a replacement for Justice Scalia
- ③ Cancel all federal funding to Sanctuary Cities
- ④ Remove the more than 2 million criminal illegal immigrants
- ⑤ Suspend immigration from terror-prone regions

Fast forward to today when things are changing. Rapidly. And in January, 2017 we will see what our future President Trump's 100 days will actually look like.

Candidate Trump closed out his “Gettysburg Address” by saying this:

“On November 8th, Americans will be voting for this 100-day plan to restore prosperity to our economy, security to our communities and honesty to our government.

“This is my pledge to you.

“And if we follow these steps, we will once more have a government of, by and for the people.”
